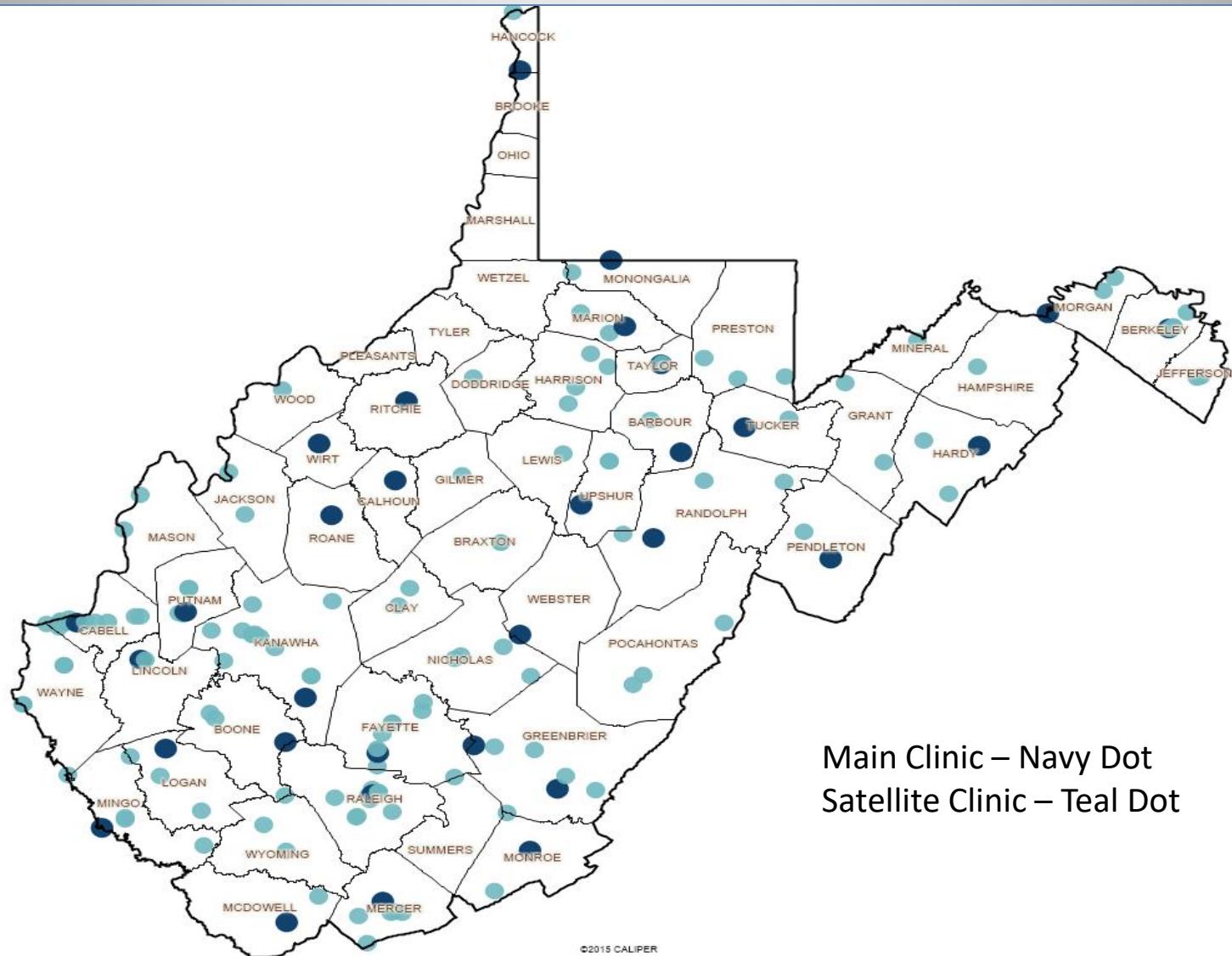

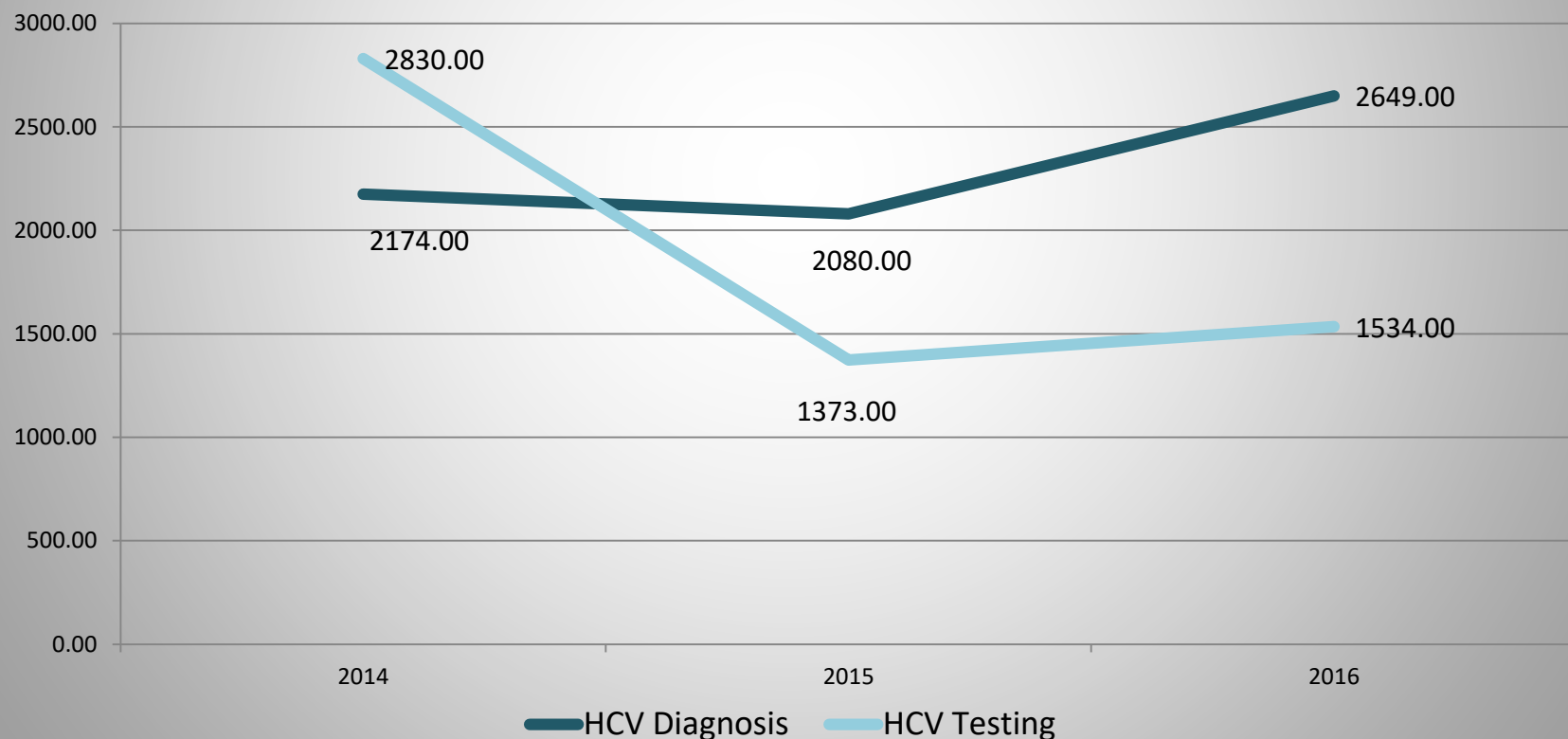
# West Virginia Primary Care Association

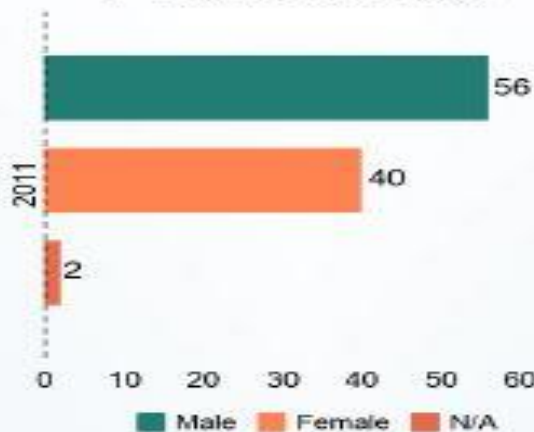

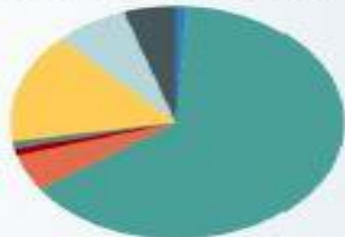

HepC Genotype

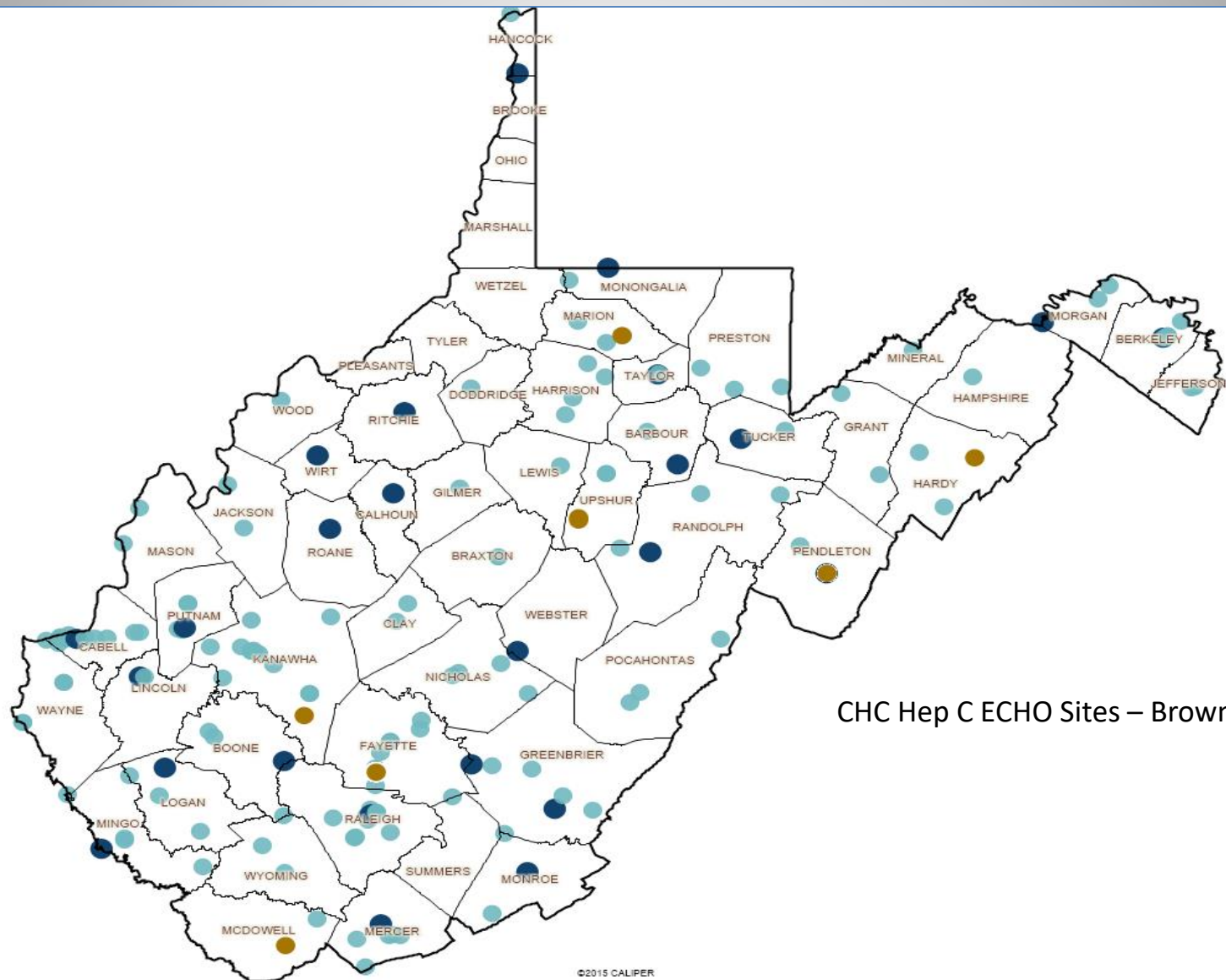

# Barriers to Diagnosis

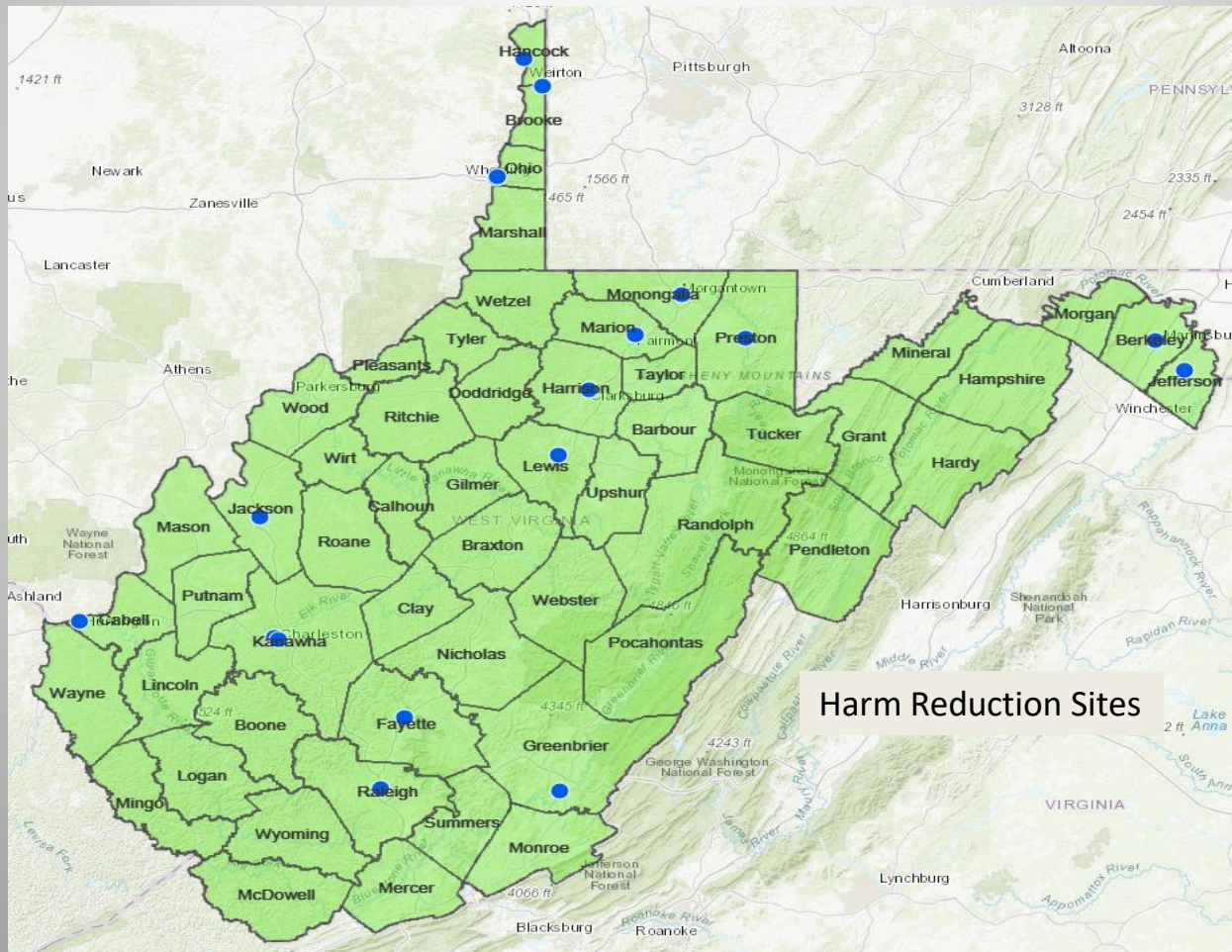
- Not screening for substance abuse

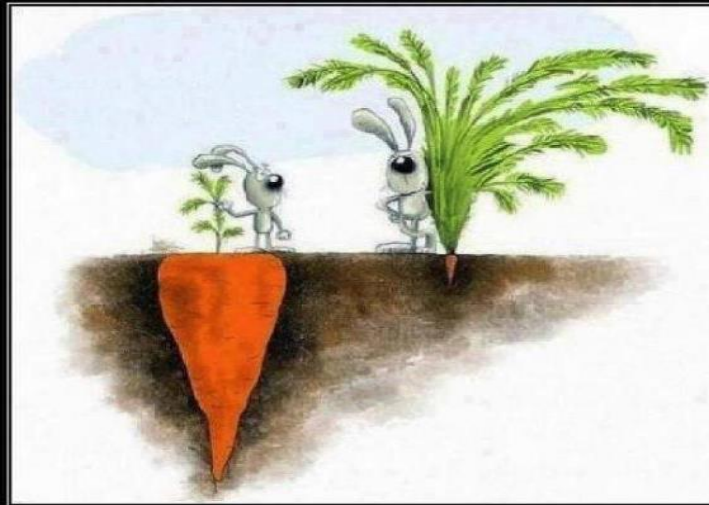
